The Erasmus+ program

Mobility is a fundamental part in the creation of a European space for higher education.

As part of the Erasmus+ program 2014-2020, individual mobility has become international through the « International Credit Mobility». The objectives are as follows:

- To allow students, teachers and staff members to carry out mobility to/or from Erasmus+ partner countries.
- To support the internationalisation of higher education institutions
- To highlight the richness and attractiveness of European Higher education
- To promote cooperation with partner countries in relation to foreign policy

Objectives

The Université Catholique de Lille takes part in the International Credit Mobility with the objectives of:

- Developing new partnerships with adjacent countries of the European union: Azerbaïdjan, Bosnia, Georgia, Russia
- Strengthening long term partnerships by developing new forms of mobility with Lebanon and India
- Helping the internationalization of its partners and their campuses by attracting students from new partners countries
- Exchanging good practices with international partners on cross-cutting themes at the University's institutions such as : innovation, sustainable development and internationalization
- Encouraging the emergence of common collaborations by education and/ or training activities

Project funding

Maximum funding for the project:
443,760€ for 136 participants in mobility activity

Project length
01/08/2020 > 31/07/2023

The European funding allows financing to:

- The participants' living expenses , in the form of a monthly (students) or daily (staff member) rate depending on the country of destination
- Traveling expenses depending on the distance per kilometer
- The management of the project (the « mobility management » budget)
- Eventual specific needs, at actual expense (reserved for individuals with disabilities)

Objectives:

- 58 mobilities of study for students : from the second year of higher education to doctoral studies (included) for a period ranging from 3 to 10 months
- 78 mobilities for staff members :
 - 37 teaching missions : for a period of 5 consecutive days of mobility in the partner institution with a minimum of 8 hours of teaching
 - 41 training missions: for a period of 5 consecutive days of mobility in the partner institution.

Implementation

- The activities of the International Credit Mobility program of the Université Catholique de Lille are coordinated by the International Relations Office as part of the Erasmus+ consortium, validated by the European Commission.
- Participants from member institutions and partner universities are financed by the program after validation of the selection by the home institution and by the UCL executive committee (2CI, Consultative Committee for the International).
