Introduction

The world is increasingly confronted with fast-growing and mutually reinforcing challenges, ranging from geoeconomic fragmentation to climate disruption and regulatory transformation. This evolving “polycrisis” is not characterised by isolated factors, but by cascading systemic risks that challenge the resilience, governance, and strategic orientation of public institutions and private sectors across Europe and beyond. In such an era of structural uncertainty, traditional siloed approaches to compliance, investment, and risk management are no longer sufficient. It requires a more unified, action-oriented response to navigate complexity and support long-term sustainable growth.

This conference is designed to provide a structured platform that integrates diverse expertise and perspectives to deepen collective understanding of these contemporary systemic challenges. It brings together leading institutional stakeholders, including representatives from the European Central Bank (ECB), the European Investment Bank (EIB), the French Social Investment Forum (FIR), the Chartered Financial Analyst Institute (CFA Institute), investment funds, as well as academic researchers, policy makers, and business leaders.

Over two days, participants will analyze geopolitical risks, climate uncertainty, compliance and governance changes, and evolving investment strategies in the EU and beyond. Day 1 focuses on resilient and sustainable investment strategies from regulators, practitioners, and academia. Day 2 features a collaborative brainstorming and discussion on geopolitical risks, compliance, and investment strategies. The outputs of the discussion will be presented as a policy brief that combines theory, practice, and evaluation tools to strengthen the EU’s strategic position.

This conference seeks to translate analytical insights into practical tools and actionable recommendations for sustainability investment, compliance, and regulations. It also aims to strengthen coordination among stakeholders and help establish a unified, sustainable, and action-oriented framework.

The discussions will focus on exploring actionable research on geopolitical risks, compliance, and investment strategies. It aims to identify thematic areas, define clear workstreams and confirm chapter contributors. The outputs will be translated into a research agenda for an edited book volume that integrates theory, practice, and evaluative tools to strengthen the EU's strategic positioning.

During the session, participants will collaboratively refine chapter themes through a structured exchange across the following dimensions:

1. Bridging research and practice: Encouraging dialogue between academics and practitioners on geopolitical risks facing the EU and examining how these dynamics are reshaping strategic domains such as AI, the climate transition, critical industries, economic strategy, and data governance.
2. From ideas to application: Identifying key challenges alongside practical, implementable solutions that can inform both policy and market responses.
3. Implementation: Highlighting the tools, mechanisms, institutional channels, and key drivers required to deliver proposed solutions.
4. Regulatory and supervisory considerations: Examining how regulatory and supervisory frameworks intersect with investment strategies, particularly in strengthening resilience under evolving global conditions.
