CLARIFE

French Language & Culture*

Contact Hours: 42 | French | ESP1&2

This course covers reading and listening comprehension, written and oral expression, and vocabulary and grammar at varied levels, through practical written and oral work, discussions, presentations and debates, role-play, and writing short essays and summaries.

*An initial placement activity will sort students from beginner to advanced levels

Project Management for Everyone

Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP1&2

This highly interactive course will provide students with methodological and practical tools to manage projects in fields ranging from engineering and science to management and communication.

Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP2

The objective of this course is to better understand the causes and consequences of climate change, as well as to look into the adaptation and mitigation strategies focusing on French and European examples.

An introduction to art and art history through an overview of the cultural heritage and museums of the Lille region in the heart of Europe. Many class sessions will take place within the museums themselves.

Film on the Western Front

Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP1

Cinema both as an art form and as an industry was greatly impacted by the First World War, and proved a notable cinematic subject even before that conflict ended. This course will examine a selection of films set on the Western Front, close to Lille.

Introduction to French & Francophone Women Writers

Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP1

An overview of the literary representation of gendered experiences in personal stories authored by a range of leading contemporary female French-speaking writers. #Arts&Society



European Humanism: Light and Shadow

of a Common History

Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP1

This course offers an immersive experience around Europe. It leads students to question the idea of a European common history and highlights its light and shadow. It will give students keys to understanding current European issues through the interweaving of European political, social, and cultural history, from Antiquity to contemporary European construction.

Thinking-With the World: Making, Experience, and **Contemporary French Thought** Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP2

This course invites students to engage deeply with a contemporary current of French and European thinkers who challenge traditional notions of objectivity, detachment, and the separation between humans and the world around them. We will also explore how artists engage with these questions through their work and consider how art can open up new understandings of what it means to think, feel, and be in relation.

Techniques of Illustration and Colour Studies

Contact Hours: 39 / English / ESP2

A practical and theoretical introduction to illustration for comics. This course will provide drawing lessons (anatomy, live model, charadesign), concept design, colours studies, narrative illustration and some basics in digital animation. A small comics or fanzine will be produced at the end.




Health: a Common Good

Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP2

This course examines how health needs are understood and addressed in our societies in relation to various disciplines, including sociology, anthropology, economics, and more, in order to help nourish critical thinking regarding the place of health in our home societies.

SUSTAINABILITY & THE SCIENCES



Case Studies in Environmental Science

Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP1

This course will introduce students to the dynamics of natural environments from geological, biological, and chemical perspectives. Students will examine environmental issues through case studies, laboratory assignments, directed research, and discussion. This course also offers a specialized module entitled Lille: Quarries, Coal, and Coastlines. The module is focused on the many unique environmental activities in the area of Lille; including historical Roman mines, current identification of biodiversity on waste piles, and future considerations of preserving GeoHeritage sites on France's northern coast.

Energy Transition and Renewable Energies

Contact Hours: 39 | English | ESP2

This course will provide students with fundamentals of energy and an overview of renewable energies and their applications, including fundamentals of Energy, Energy transition and Renewable Energy Sources, Photovoltaic installation, Solar Thermal Energy Systems, Wind Energy Systems, Biomass and other sources, LCC and LCA of renewable energy sources.

A strong commitment to transition,

preparing the world of tomorrow



In 2022, the University reaffirmed its commitment to the climate through the #ClimateltIsTime (#ClimatIIEstTemps) campaign and through numerous conferences, workshops, and other activities. The end of the year was marked by the very first "University Climate Convention," which brought together the entire University community – students, faculty, staff, and local residents.

The commitment of the *Université Catholique de Lille* is shared across its faculties and schools, many of which offer specialized programs emphasizing sustainable development. Recent years have seen the emergence of additional spaces for education, research, and experimentation. New buildings have been designed and built in order to limit their carbon impact and demonstrate good practices. The campus now benefits from more than 2,000 m² of solar panels and 15 energy transition experimentation sites, as well as from strong student participation, including 40 student associations dedicated to the environment.





LILLE a city of art, culture, and history

A rich history at the crossroads of europe



Founded in 1066 by the Count of Flanders, Lille – *Rijsel* in Flemish – became an important trading and stock market point on the route between the rich Flemish towns and the Champagne fairs. As evident from some of its architecture, Lille was successively Flemish, Burgundian, and Spanish before finally becoming French in 1667 under Louis XIV, whose military engineer, Vauban, built Lille's impressive Citadel.

Yet the city has never stopped reinventing itself through successive economic, social, and power shifts. Lille's strategic location and the area's rich resources have made it one of the most fought over regions in Europe, a history visible today particularly through the numerous memorials from the last two World Wars in the region, toured by national and international visitors each year.





Big city advantages with small city atmosphere



Lille enjoys all of the conveniences of being at the centre of a cross-border urban zone with a population of over 2 million, yet remains a "human-sized" university city with under 250,000 inhabitants, nearly half of whom are under age 30! Visitors can get around easily on foot or by bicycle. Public transport also offers the metro, the tramway, and many bus lines running frequently and late into the night, not to mention convenient train connections to the rest of the region and indeed Europe as a whole.



City of art & culture



Since its designation as a European Capital of Culture in 2004, Lille Métropole has sponsored themed arts festivals with specific international connections every few years. The city was also designated a World Design Capital in 2020. But the arts are on display all year, every year. Lille boasts a significant number of theatres, concert venues, movie theatres, an opera house, and a national orchestra. Annual cultural events include, among many others, the Lille Piano(s) Festival, International Independent Movie Week, the international "Series Mania" festival, the Wazemmes accordion festival, and the "Fête de la"

Musique" (country-wide) on 21 June with free concerts all over town.

And then there are all the world-renowned museums in the region, which include the centrally-located *Palais des Beaux-Arts* (boasting the largest art collection in France outside of Paris), the *Louvre-Lens* (a nearby outpost of the Louvre itself), *La Piscine* in Roubaix (built in a former art deco swimming pool), and a modern art museum with a unique collection. Most museums are free or have reduced rates for students.


